Dear Families,

I hope everyone is well and feeling that Spring is on its way. As ever, St. Mary's has been really busy. Last week, for the first time in ages, we were able to have Mass in school, with the children, staff and some parishioners. Fr. Jonathan came and Ash Wednesday Mass was celebrated in the school hall. The children were praised by everyone for their outstanding respectful behaviour and their ability to sit and listen for a long period of time. They learnt about Lent and the importance of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

On Monday, the Year Six children lead a fantastic Lent Liturgy to the whole school which explained in more detail about Lent. At one point, the Year Six children lead a quiz with the whole school and it was amazing to see how many of the children had retained lots of information about Lent and what this time of year means within a Catholic school. Well done to Year Six for leading this Liturgy, especially when most of them had been in London on their residential the week before.

I would like to thank all the parents and carers who completed the questionnaire that was sent out to answer questions and voice opinions on St. Mary's school. I was overwhelmed and humbled at the vast majority of positive and wonderful comments that were given. Thank-you to everyone for taking the time to complete the questionnaire. All the information has now been analysed and here is a summary:

"My child feels safe and happy at St. Mary's": 98% of responses agreed with these statement.

"I have found it easy to contact the school if needed" and "I find the newsletters useful": 96% of responses agreed with these statements.

"My child makes good progress at St. Mary's" and "My child receives appropriate homework for their age": 93% of responses agreed with these statements.

However, I would like to show as a school how we are responding to the areas within the questionnaire where concerns were voiced by some parents/carers. With the statement "St Mary's deals effectively with bullying" only 70% of parents agreed with this statement. Therefore as a school a number of changes have been introduced. These include beginning a whole school positive behaviour/anti-bullying campaign. This will also be linked to British Values and the importance of how we treat each other. Children will be reminded regularly about Bullying being - Several Times On Purpose and You must - Start Telling Other People.

LONDON TRIP YEAR 6 RESIDENTIAL

Monday 28th February - Thursday 3rd March

Year Six pupils on their residential trip, had a brilliant time and learnt a great deal. Two of the highlights were:

Meeting a Yeomen Warder (Beefeater) at The Tower of London, the children were told a number of things including about the raven birds that their presence is traditionally believed to protect The Crown and the Tower; a superstition holds that "if the Tower of London ravens are lost or fly away, the Crown will fall and Britain with it."





Going to The Houses of Parliament, everyone stood in the House of Commons and the House of Lords. The children took part in a debating workshop and learnt how laws (Acts of Parliament) are written and passed.
