RSHE – we will be looking at Me, My body and My

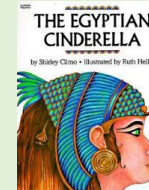
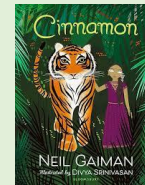
Health and Emotional Well-Being. Children will learn to celebrate similarities and differences, and to appreciate and look after their bodies as gifts from God. They will learn about different emotions in greater depth and how to manage 'bigger' emotions.

English:

Reading text: Cinnamon by Neil Gaiman and The Egyptian Cinderella by Shirley Climo

Writing genres:

- Limericks (Poetry)
- Diary Entry
- Narrative story writing



Spellings:

- Children will be accessing Active Spelling 4 days a week.

Maths

Number: Multiplication and Division



Children will be using the times table knowledge to multiply 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers. We will be focussing on reasoning questions.

Measurement: Length and Perimeter

Children will learn how to convert between mm, cm and m, using them to calculate the length and perimeter of different objects.

Science: Light

We will learn about:

- The difference between light and dark.
- The difference types of light.
- How reflections and shadows occur.
- How different materials effect light.



History: Ancient Egyptians

Children will learn about the significance of Gods, monuments and life after death to Egyptian people. This will help them to understand how the Ancient Egyptian came to be so wealthy.



Art: Craft and Design – Ancient Egyptian Scrolls

Children will learn about Ancient Egyptian artwork, focussing on the background, textures, colours, patters and lines, to create an Egyptian scroll.

Pupils will learn how to: Recognise, recall, and spell 10 instruments in French, using the correct determiner for each word.
