




Religious Education: Community

Giving and Receiving

Ten:Ten Resources



Children will recognise that people are unique and that our similarities and differences should be celebrated. Pupils will also be given an opportunity to reflect on God's love as the foundation of our self-confidence.

classification and grouping animals in a variety of ways. We will also be looking at endangered species and how environmental changes can cause dangers to living things.

Computing: This unit is the first of the two programming units in Year 4, and looks at repetition and loops within programming. Pupils will create programs by planning, modifying, and testing commands to create shapes and patterns. They will use Logo, a text-based programming
