RSHE: Life Cycles

Life Cycles explores the miraculous nature of human

conception and birth and offers an opportunity for thanksgiving. (Note that sexual intercourse is not discussed in this unit.) Death and life after it is further discussed, alongside the complexities of grief where children will consider ways to support themselves and others. The unit is concluded by children reflecting on change now they are older.



We will be finishing off our Decimals topic before starting to look at Money and Time.

We will be using our knowledge of Decimals to write in pounds and pence. We will be converting and comparing amounts. We will then move onto Time where we will be converting between analogue and digital time.

We will also be looking at times tables ready for our times tables test in June.



Science: Sound

We will be looking at how sounds are made, how we hear sounds and what soundwaves are and how the ear works. We will be looking at what pitch and volume are and experimenting with sounds.

History: Anglo-Saxons

We will be looking at who the Anglo-Saxons were and why they came to Briton. We will be looking at the many Anglo-Saxon kingdoms and their hierarchy. We will be exploring some Anglo-Saxon artefacts and working out their purpose.



Art: Sculpture

We are going to be designing a 2D model before turning into 3D. We will be using wire to make our own sculptures. We will be thinking about how to display them. We will be going to Burghley House to look at the Sculpture Park there.
