- Promises Children will be exploring the big question 'Why make promises?'


RSHE

Science: Light

- Light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes
- Shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object
- There are patterns in the way that the size of shadows change








