Religious Education

Pupils learn about key beliefs and practices in other religions and begin to make thoughtful comparisons with Christianity.

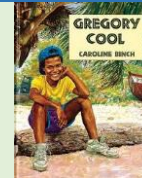


RSHE –

Children will learn about:
How to use technology safely and how to respond to inappropriate images/videos/messages.
How to keep safe in the real world and how that links in with our Gospel Values.
How the Holy Trinity plays a part in our everyday lives.
How to live as part of a wider community.

English:

Reading text: Gregory Cool by Caroline Birch and The Adventure at Brimstone Hill by Carol Ottley-Mitchell

Spellings:

- Children will be accessing Active Spelling 4 days a week.

Maths



Measurement: Time

Children will learn how to tell the time to the minute, and understand the different durations of time (year, month, week, day, hour, minute, second)

Geometry: Shape

Children will explore angles and begin to draw different shapes building on knowledge of 2D and 3D shapes..

Statistics:

Children will interpret different graphs, pictograms and charts, and begin to collect and present data in different ways.

Science: Rocks and Fossils

We will learn about:

- The different properties of rocks.
- How to test the durability of rocks.
- How fossils are formed.
- The different uses of natural and man-made rocks.



Geography: Land Use

Children will learn about how land is used in their local area, and compare the ways in which land is used now, to how it was used in the past.



DT: Drawing/Craft and Design – Electrical Circuits

Children will be discovering how electrical circuits and electricity can be used within design to attract an audience. By the end of the unit, they will have designed, made and evaluated their own poster that uses a circuit.

Key Dates:

Music will be taught by a visiting musician.

Children will learn about Latin music and they will compose and improvise a 4 bar rhythm, performing in front of the whole school with control, musicianship and rhythmic accuracy.



French (KS2): Fruits

In this unit pupils will learn 10 fruits and be introduced to the simple opinions 'I like' and 'I do not like'. By the end of the unit pupils will have the knowledge and skills to be able to say which fruits they like and do not like.

Computing: Events and actions in programs

Children will use a selection of motion, sound and event blocks to create their own programs, thinking about linking events and actions.
